British Choirs on the Net

Welcome to the first Newsletter of 2019 and a Happy New Year. As we enter 2019 it's nice to reflect on a musically successful 2018. In terms of status, singing with the Abertillery Orpheus Male Voice Choir at the Royal Albert Hall as part of the Massed Welsh Male Voice Choirs Concert thas to take top spot, although in terms of enjoyment singing with the same choir at my old parish Church of St David in Exeter was the highlight.

I have recently become an International Member of the American Choral Directors Association (ACDA). This together with my membership of the Association of British Choral Conductors (ABCD) and the International Federation of Choral Music (IFCM) has opened up more contacts and a wider choral advocacy outreach.

This newsletter has been sent to you as you or your choir are currently listed on one of the sites, or because the services you provide may be suitable for our website. In some cases it is sent to you as you have specifically requested a mailing. Whatever the reason, you are very welcome.

We have a listing of well over 4,000 choirs which have either websites, facebook entries or email addresses listed on the site. Given the popularity of choirs, covering various genres and styles, this number is only likely to grow and we welcome news of new choirs and their concerts.

Please continue to review your choir entries to ensure the listings remain as up to date as possible and advise if website addresses or facebook addresses change, if the conductor details change or if the email contact for the choir changes. Please review your choir entries on a regular basis and advise if any of the Information needs to be updated. Where a choir has a website, that will be listed as the main contact point, otherwise facebook links or emails will be used. In order to promote choir websites and facebook pages we do not list choirs that are only contactable by telephone or post.

Concertfinder & British Choirs on the Net

Concertfinder is a free online concert diary. It is part of British Choirs on the Net under www.choirs.org.uk and also a standalone website under www.concertfinder.co.uk.

During 2017 we listed 553 concerts while in 2018 we listed, and provided free advertising, a total of 580 concerts. While the works being performed are dominated by the usual suspects; Faure, Durufle, Mozart and Brahms Requiems, Rossini's Missa Solennele and Handel's Messiah there have also been a small number of World Premieres by Will Todd, Roderick Williams and Owain Park as well as new works specially commissioned for the 100th anniversary of the end of the First World War, as well as concerts to mark Hubert Parry's Centenary

Each concert is listed with the same prominence and for this reason I do not include the conductors or soloists details. Additionally non choral works are omitted from the listing even when they form part of the concert programme. The only exception to this general rule is in December when I am happy to list Brass Bands where they are performing Christmas concerts with choirs.

Please submit your concert details via email in text format. Please do not send pdf or html posters which require the salient points to be extracted and this can delay posting the concert. Also do not forget to let me know the date of the concert as well as the who, where, what and ticket information. You will often find that I do not acknowledge the email, so please check the site to see if it has been added. www.concertfinder.co.uk

If you use a ticket agency which adds a booking fee please ensure the ticket price you advertise is the full price you pay (including handling costs).

British Choirs on the Net Mailing Services

British Choirs on the Net holds a database of over 3,000 choir email contacts as a result of its business with these choirs. There mailing addresses are collected whenever you ask for your choir to be listed. Email details may also be collected from public domain sources such as websites. We do not purchase email lists and we do not sell on our lists.

These mailing lists are very important both to provide you with information from our subscribers, information about other choral services, concerts and general updates such as this newsletter. It is also important because it generate a small revenue which allows us to ensure that at least 90% of the content on British Choirs on the Net is free to list.

It is understood that some of the mailings may not be of interest to all the choirs, particularly if you are not a choir that tours or takes part in competitions, but I hope over the course of the year you will find items of interest. Recent mailings include Brandenburg Choral Festival of Music, CSSM Summer School, Hannah Brice, Isle of Man Festival, Oxford University Press and a crowdfunding project for a handheld music stand for choristers.

Choirsites

They say every picture tells a story and the same rule applies with choirs. The choir that has a website where potential members can see pictures of the choir, their future concerts and repertoire is likely to prove more attractive than simply a listed choir with a text description and an e-mail contact. Choirsites provides low cost website hosting and design for choirs. Some of the choirs using this service include:

The visit continues through the old town around the Cathedral: this area was an important Jewish centre, which can be best admired at "El Call" where Jewish legacy has been kept almost intact. In the afternoon/evening, Farewell Concert of all participating choirs in a local concert hall followed by a Farewell Dinner with music and dance.

DAY 4: Breakfast at the Hotel. Departure. (Choirs can opt to extend their stay and add additional activities or visits of their choice).

Ben Parry is guest tutor at Sing for Pleasure's choral conducting Masterclass in London National choral charity Sing for Pleasure (SfP) is pleased to confirm that renowned choral conductor, composer and singer Ben Parry will be guest Masterclass tutor at its first training weekend of 2019, to be held on 2 and 3 February in Victoria, London. Ben, whose credentials include his role as Artistic Director of the National Youth Choirs of Great Britain, Co-Director of London Voices and Music Director of Aldeburgh Voices, will be working with SfP's most experienced choral conducting students who have attained Advanced level, and the Masterclass has been fully subscribed since before Christmas.

Manvinder Rattan, SfP's Chief Executive and Head of Conductor Training, commented: "Demand for places on Ben's Masterclass - and indeed all our choral conducting courses runing over this upcoming training weekend - has been huge. In fact, we've drafted in additional tutors to lead extra course groups, particularly at Foundation level for beginners, and Intermediate 1 level for those with a little prior conducting experience."

Manvinder will be leading the charity's popular introductory orchestral conducting course in London next month, for those with relevant experience who want to broaden their skills and learn the fundamentals of this particular discipline. He added: "There are subtle differences in technique and skills which conductors need to lead orchestras effectively, either on a stand-alone basis or when accompanying choirs. The orchestral conducting course is actually open to individuals who haven't necessarily followed SfP's choral conductor training programme; and although we have certain criteria in place for prospective attendees in terms of previous experience, I'm very willing to talk through the details with those interested in taking part - we still have a few places left."

"I should add that we can still take one or two more on our Musicianship for Singers course, which is a great opportunity for choir members to build on notation sight-reading skills and gain a deeper understanding of music theory from a singer's perspective."

Lacock Courses for Choral and Consort Singers

We have just published details of three new courses in the second half of 2019 – you will be able to find the full details of them all on our web site <u>www.lacock.org</u>. The first is a return to Ludlow in mid-July with Gabriel Crouch for a programme of music in 40 parts: Spem in alium by Tallis, Ecce beatam lucem by Striggio and a newly reconstructed anonymous setting of the Ten Commandments, Unum cole Deum. Taking part in a performance of these monumental pieces – we will probably perform them in a circle round Ludlow's vast nave – is a musical experience quite unlike any other, so do come if you are at all interested. You can tell us in your application whether you prefer to sing a line by yourself or one with others. The course will include instruments under the tutelage of David Hatcher.

Next is a Patrick Craig week in September in Jimena de la Frontera, an Andalusian pueblo blanco that has been a favourite Lacock venue since the nineties – an unpretentious working town of great charm and character. It is on the edge of a vast empty stretch of cork oak forest, so still has the frontier feeling to it. Patrick's programme will be psalm settings by English and Spanish composers. This year we will be back in the church of San Francisco in the heart of the old town.

There will be a long-awaited return to Rome in October, when Justin Doyle will direct a week centred on Victoria's Missa Gaudeamus, a six-voice work dating from Victoria's two decades there. It combines order and beauty of Italian polyphony with all the passion and fervour of Spain. The venue will be All Saints' Anglican church, in Via del Babuino in the central Tridente area, near the Spanish Steps. In 1571 Pope Pius V installed a public drinking fountain in the street, complete with a statue of the classical deity Silenus. The thankless townsfolk did not judge the sculpture to be a thing of beauty and soon dubbed it II Babuino, baboon in the Romanesco dialect.

In general, the courses announced last time – the Lewes Lamentations with Eamonn Dougan and Jo Tomlinson's week at Monteconero – are now largely full, but it's still worth asking if you are interested in joining either. Unusually there are a couple of soprano places still going at Monteconero and others come up from time to time in all voices through cancellations. We could even squeeze you into JanJoost van Elburg's week in Tobago, which kicks off on 10 February.

Looking further ahead, we have decided that Corsham works so well as a venue for the winter school that we hold it there again this year. The tutor will be Will Dawes of Lo Stile Antico and the dates 28 December to 2 January 2020. This will be followed by another week in Tobago with Justin Doyle from 16 to 22 February 2020.
