This newsletter has been sent to you as you or your choir are currently listed on one of the sites, or because the services you provide may be suitable for our website. In some cases it is sent to you as you have specifically requested a mailing. Whatever the reason, you are very welcome.

We are delighted to welcome back Melody Music and Olton Travel as travel and Tour subscription advertisers to British Choirs on the Net. We are also pleased to welcome BlackDressCode who supply stylist performance clothing for Musicians. The monies we receive from subscribers enable use to cover the hosting costs of the site and means that we can make 90% of the site contents free to list. In return they receive very low cost advertising in a specialist market.

We have also streamlined some pages on the website (www.choirs.org.uk) so the links page now includes location recording and rehearsal aids, rather than these being separate pages.

Last month I attended, along with my fellow singers from the Abertillery Orpheus Male Choir, my first 'Sangerstevne' style choir festival at St Mary's Church Beaconsfield. Each choir performs a short set of songs, and forms the audience for the other choirs in their concert. At the end of their concert, all the choirs join together to perform two simple songs that have been sent to them in advance. To make it more manageable and varied the 24 choirs where split into 4 concerts of 6 choirs each. It was a very enjoyable experience, although with my commercial head on it seemed a shame that 80% of the sale-able ticket space was taken up by choir members waiting to sing. However that is the purpose of the Sangerstevne, choirs singings for the entertainment of other choirs.

British Choirs on the Net British Choirs on the Net has been running for over 15 years and, with over 3,640 choirs listed, some of this details regarding choirs may have changed i.e. conductor details, size of choir, choir re-names, email addresses or website choir addresses, etc. Please review your choir entries on a regular basis and advise if any information needs to be updated. Where a choir has a website, that will be listed as the main contact point, otherwise Facebook links or emails will be used. In order to promote choir websites and Facebook usage we do not list choirs that are only contactable by telephone or post.

British Choirs on the Net Mailing Services British Choirs on the Net holds a database of over 2600 choir email contacts as a result of its business with these choirs. There mailing addresses are collected whenever you ask for your choir to be listed or may be collected from other registers such as the National Association of Choirs and ABCD.

These mailing lists are important to provide you with information from our subscribers, information about other choral services, concerts and general updates such as this newsletter. It is also important because it generate a small revenue which allows us to ensure that at least 90% of the content on British Choirs on the Net is free to list.

It is understood that some of the mailings may not be of interest to all the choirs, particularly if you are not a choir that tours or takes part in competitions, but I hope over the course of the year you will find something useful in the mailings. The mailing list is not just for big organizations. For instance there are 261 listed choirs in London. This means that if a London choir is looking to put bums on seats, either in terms of audience or singers, or if it wants to advertise a Come and Sing performance or Workshop it can use the mailing list to target the other 260 choirs on the London list.

During this year to date, we have sent out mailings for Nonsuch Singers, CSSM Summer School , London Concert Choir, RunbySingers, Isle of Man Choral Festival, Limerick Sings and Oxford University Press.

British Choirs on the Net Choral Conductors Forum This is a group set up on Facebook to enable Choral Directors, Choirs Secretaries and Choir members to informally discuss issues of performance practice, request new music and music exchanges, and discuss other choral related issues. It is also increasing used to advertise vacancies for Music Directors/Accompanists. Concertfinder & British Choirs on the Net

Concertfinder is a free online concert diary. It is part of British Choirs on the Net under www.choirs.org.uk and also a standalone website under www.concertfinder.co.uk

During 2016 we listed, and provided free advertising, for a total of 523 concerts. The works that dominate the listings are the usual suspects—Faure, Durufle, Mozart and Brahms Requiems, Rossini's Missa Solennelle and Handel's Messiah. There has also been an increase in part staged/dramatized performances particularly of the Bach Passions.

There has been a number of rare or new pieces including the London premiere of Hywel Davies' "War Songs", the UK premiere of AI Fedak's "Spring Bursts Forth", Richard Rodney Bennett's "A farewell to Arms", Hugo Distler's "Choralpassion", Peter Smith's "Benedicite", the premiere of Julian Marshall's "Dark Disputes and Artful Teasing", the premiere of Kerry Andrew's "The flight be fleet: Trainsongs!", the premiere of Ian Assersohn's "Dies Irae" and the UK premier of Howard Goodall's "Sure of the Sky, sure of the Sun".

Other works of interest include James Pelham's "A Shriopshire Lad", Arwel Hughes' "Gweddi (A Prayer)", Ronald Corp's "And all the trumpets sounded" and Bob Chilcott's "Gloria". On the debit side it is a shame that we seem to have lost older Easter favourites such as Stainer's "Crucifixion" and Maunder's "Olivet to Calvary". They are both fine works in their own right and also great pieces for audience participation.

Concert Programme Notes British Choirs on the Net hosts a library of Choral repertoire programme notes which are available for the free use of Choral Societies. We do ask however that you acknowledge in your concerts the authorship of these programme notes, as appropriate.

VocalBroker This is a site which lists vocal soloists seeking work with Choral Societies and Choruses on the Oratorio or concert platform. It is not an agency and the Societies negotiate directly with singers with Vocalbroker taking no commission. They are all experienced singers and choral societies, and choruses are asked to consider these singers when selecting voices for concerts. www.vocalbroker.co.uk

Choral Vacancies. This page, which is part of British Choirs on the Net, is particularly successful at placing candidates in Choral Music posts.

The listing covers Musical Director/Choir Leader vacancies and also Accompanist vacancies. There are also listing of candidates who are seeking work as Musical Directors or Accompanists. Finally there are list of choirs seeking singers. To list you vacancy just email the details. Please be clear if the post is paid, unpaid or honorarium. Also where possible please include a closing date for applications.

Choral Arrangements for Male Voice Choirs Gwyn Arch is a composers and arranger with something of an obsession with MVC music and now has 160 arrangements, mostly TTBB, in his catalogue www.malechoirmusic.co.uk.

The catalogue now includes a section labelled '2-part arrangements'. They are invariably derived from the 4-part versions, and the accompaniments are the same. We often need more rehearsal time for a concert, and the addition of the occasional (or frequent!) 2-part arrangement saves a lot of rehearsal time and 'works' well. In general, the music meets the needs of male voice choirs looking for a broader variety of styles in their repertoire. Nearly all the music has been rehearsed and performed in many concerts before being selected for publication.

Most of these arrangements have been written by Gwyn Arch, a specialist in the field, and one of the most frequently-published and performed choral arrangers in the UK. He has over 45 years as a male choir director, male voice music arranger and choral adjudicator.

LIMERICK SING'S INTERNATIONAL CHORAL FESTIVAL 2017 IS LAUNCHED IN CONJUNCTION WITH 30TH ANNIVERSARY CONCERT BY ANÚNA

The 5th annual Limerick Sings International Choral Festival was launched this week at University Concert Hall, to coincide with the 30th Anniversary concert of acclaimed vocal group Anúna. A vocal workshop curated by members of Anúna's Education Programme is just one of a number of exciting new additions to this year's festival programme.

Deputy Mayor Noel Gleeson, together with University Concert Hall Director Sinéad Hope and Campus Life Services Sales and Marketing Manager, Gillian Costelloe welcomed guests including representatives from some of the participating choirs, host venues and friends of the festival.

Limerick Sings International Choral Festival is a non-competitive weekend, presented annually by Campus Life Services and University Concert Hall which this year will run from Thursday 22nd to Sunday 25th June.

Once again the festival is working with Perform International, a leading music tour company based in Atlanta, to attract US choirs. To date 200 American choristers are already confirmed to attend including *Canterbury Voices* (Oklahoma), *Tallahassee Community Chorus* (Florida), *Pensacola Children's Chorus* (Florida) and *Oswego Festival Chorus* (New York) as well as *Fairfield County Children's Choir* (Connecticut).

From closer to home, a further 200 Irish choristers will join them including the city's own *Limerick* Choral Union and Aoide together with The Gunas, Dalkey Active Retirement Association Choir and Maynooth Chamber Choir.

Choristers and audiences can look forward to performances in spectacular venues throughout the Region including St. John's Cathedral, University Concert Hall, Holy Trinity Abbey Church Adare and the Cliffs of Moher which will provide the stunning backdrop for a "Big Sing". There will also be choral trail performances throughout Limerick city as well as the eagerly anticipated vocal workshop with *Anúna*.

With a diverse programme featuring classical, sacred and contemporary music there will be something for all music lovers in Limerick this June!

International Ticket Launch for Cornwall's World Choral Festival. News Release: Immediate



As choirs from across the globe plan their descent on Cornwall for its 2017 International Male Choral Festival, the Hall for Cornwall has announced the ticket launch for what is now the largest event of its kind in the World.

Sixty choirs of all ages and nationalities will be converging on Cornwall – with more than 50 concerts and celebrations in 40 venues across the county running from April 27 – May 1 2017. This year's Festival will also see the largest Choir Competition in the biennial event's fourteen year history.

Cornwall will be centre stage when 2000 singers of all ages and nationalities converge to entertain an estimated 45,000 people in theatres, churches, tourist attractions and castles from Bude to Land's End and Porthleven to Saltash.

Singers, their entourages and countless visitors will be heading this way from Australia and America, Russia and across Europe, Wales, Scotland, England and, of course, Cornwall itself for this year's extraordinary Festival.

"It's going to be a wonderful long-weekend of choirs singing for pleasure as well as taking part in keen competition," says Festival Director Rob Elliott. "We look forward to welcoming visitors and singers alike to this beautiful part of the world. The sound the choirs make is always stirring and uplifting and I cannot wait to hear them brought together for this world-great event. "Our Eighth Festival is attracting more interest than ever from people wanting to join the celebrations and with ever more foreign and larger choirs it is all very exciting."

Sing for Pleasure to align training programme for teachers to new DfE standard

National choral charity Sing for Pleasure (SfP) is pleased to announce that its Vocal Leadership Training Programme (VLTP) specifically designed to develop teachers' singing leadership skills is aligning to the Department for Education's new Standard for Teachers' Professional Development, which was published in July 2016.

Introduced by SfP in 2015, the VLTP is based on the charity's successful 5 Day Course (Foundation & Intermediate 1 levels) and enables teachers to become confident and effective singing leaders, whilst at the same time building a powerful network of singing practice in an area, supported by SfP's wealth of unaccompanied repertoire. Since its launch, some 13 programmes have been run or are presently running across England, principally in partnership with music education hubs.

Feedback from those following the programme has been immensely positive, as borne out by one participant's words: "It has changed the way that I teach new songs to the academy, to the choir and in class. It has made me more confident in teaching music, particularly singing and championing singing in my school." According to Baz Chapman, former Sing Up Programme Director, who is rolling out the programme to music education hubs, "the new DfE Standard recognises value of external expertise in providing high quality Continuing Professional Development and Learning (CPDL), but also stresses the importance of the 3 way partnership between provider, participant and school. This is at the heart of SfP's approach with the VLTP, and the Standard provides a valuable framework to ensure our programmes continue to achieve excellence."

Manvinder Rattan, Sing for Pleasure's Chief Executive and Head of Conductor Training, commented: "The SfP management team views this as a statement of our ongoing commitment to highest quality CPDL in vocal leadership. It's particularly important to see this rigour in schools so that children can benefit from the best possible musical experience, which is such an important part of their education."

Unmissable Singing & Recording Workshop at top London studio

Inspirational music producer and choir director James Hawkins, who took the London Hospices Choir to the top of the Official Singles Chart last Christmas, is now inviting singers of all standards to join him take part in a studio recording workshop as part of a pop-up choir on Saturday May 6th.

James had arranged for the 300-strong London Hospices Choir to record 'The Living Years' with lead vocalist Paul Carrack at the iconic Abbey Road Studios, resulting in the song spending two weeks at the top of the Official Physical Sales Chart. He is returning there with this unique pop-up choir on Saturday May 6th to record a series of tracks including songs by Carole King and the Beach Boys and all singers are invited to attend.

This workshop led by James will give amateur singers of all levels a unique perspective on how they perform, using the process of recording and playback to help develop singers' tuning, timing and togetherness. James, who was also responsible for producing the Military Wives single '500 miles', directs the Missing People Choir and runs Eclipse Choirs at All Saints Church in Kingston, will also be focussing on the difference 'singing with purpose' makes to a performance.

He says, "I find that the production process is much more collaborative than traditional choir teaching as it allows performers to interact with their own performance, hear what they really sound like immediately via playback, and work with me to refine it. Having studied music technology at Kingston University and trained singers in a studio for years I learned how to get the best out of them using technology as an aid. Combine this approach with focussing on the purpose behind a performance and you create dynamite"
